THE DUEF



PRESENTATION OF THE UNIVERSITY DIPLOMA IN FRENCH STUDIES:

The University Diploma in French Studies (DUEF) is an intensive course, organised by semester, designed for learning French as a foreign language. It aims to develop language proficiency and promote a better understanding of French culture. At the most advanced levels, emphasis is also placed on academic methodology, with a view to successful integration into higher education in France.

The DUEF is offered at five levels, in accordance with the descriptors of the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR): A1, A2, B1, B2 and C1. Each level is subject to a university diploma awarded upon successful completion of assessments and allows for the validation of 30 European credits per semester.

The DUEF B2 and C1 diplomas are recognised by many French universities as proof of language proficiency for admission to university courses.

Each session comprises 12 weeks of classes, followed by an examination session. The weekly timetable comprises between 18 and 21 hours, divided into thematic and linguistic teaching units.

Two sessions are offered each year:

- Semester 1: September to December
- Semester 2: January to April

Before classes begin, a placement test is organised to determine the most appropriate level for each student.

GENERAL OBJECTIVES

The DUEF A1 is an introduction to the French language. Its objective is to provide learners with the fundamental linguistic tools and basic communication skills necessary to interact in simple everyday situations.

At the end of the course, students will be able to participate in very basic oral exchanges, understand simple written messages relating to everyday life, and provide personal information such as their identity, activities, or daily habits.

GENERAL OBJECTIVES

During the DUEF A2 course, you will develop the ability to establish social contact in French and participate in simple exchanges on familiar topics. You will learn to express your tastes, activities, hobbies and personal experiences. In addition, you will become familiar with different types of informative texts and will be able to write short stories about personal events.

GENERAL OBJECTIVES

As part of the DUEF B1 course, students will learn how to justify and defend an opinion, both orally and in writing, as well as how to construct a simple argument. They will also be trained to handle unexpected situations with ease. Enriching their vocabulary will enable them to effectively identify various pieces of information in everyday documents (letters, leaflets, official documents) and to understand most oral exchanges or audio documents on subjects related to their interests.

GENERAL OBJECTIVES

The DUEF B2 aims to strengthen students' linguistic autonomy by providing them with the skills necessary to participate easily in most oral exchanges. They will be able to write various types of documents (letters, reports, narratives) fluently, appreciate accessible literary texts, and independently check the grammatical and lexical accuracy of their work in order to significantly reduce errors.

GENERAL OBJECTIVES

Beyond the language proficiency expected at level B2, the DUEF C1 aims to develop advanced academic skills. Students will learn how to structure and present an oral presentation in a clear and coherent manner, take notes effectively, and write complex argumentative texts that meet academic requirements.

The course will also strengthen oral and written comprehension skills, refining the ability to identify implicit elements in speech, understand allusions and appreciate stylistic effects.

At this level, learners will be able to follow a film in French without major difficulty, even when faced with different accents or colloquial expressions.

ASSESSMENT METHODS



METHOD OF ASSESSING KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS:

French language skills are assessed mainly through continuous assessment (CC), based on regular assessments throughout the semester.

Specialist units, on the other hand, may be subject to different assessment methods:

- continuous assessment (CC),
- final assessment (CT), organised during end-of-semester examinations,
- or a mixed method, combining continuous assessment and end-of-term assessment.

The minimum final mark required to pass the DUEF and progress to the next level is 10/20. The marks obtained in the various skill blocks enable an overall assessment of the student's progress.

If a student fails the semester, they may take a second chance exam, subject to the approval of the jury.

For further details, please refer to the DUEF examination charter.

ABSENCES:

In the event of absence from an assessment, whether continuous or final, students must provide proof of absence within five working days of the date of the assessment in question.

Any unjustified absence will result in the award of an "ABI" (unjustified absence) mark, which will make it impossible to validate the diploma for the semester in question.

EXAM FRAUD OR ATTEMPTED FRAUD

Any fraud or attempted fraud during an assessment, whether it be continuous assessment or a final examination (examples: use of unauthorised documents or materials, unauthorised communication during the examination, plagiarism, etc.), constitutes an infringement of academic rules university rules.

Such actions may result in the cancellation of the exam or all of the semester's results.
